# UHMC in Service to Maui Nui

*We were there!*

- UHMC in Partnership with DOH administered thousands of COVID shots on our campus.
  - UHMC Culinary students prepared meals to feed COVID vax clinic volunteers.
- DOH and National Guard utilized UHMC facilities to perform contact tracing.
- Served 200K meals to Lāhaina residents displaced by wildfires.
- Expanding training opportunities in the trades to support rebuilding in the burn zones.
  - Part of training is building storage sheds and providing them to those impacted by the wildfires.
- Lomilomi & Ho‘oponopono being deployed to support mental health wellness to those impacted by wildfires.

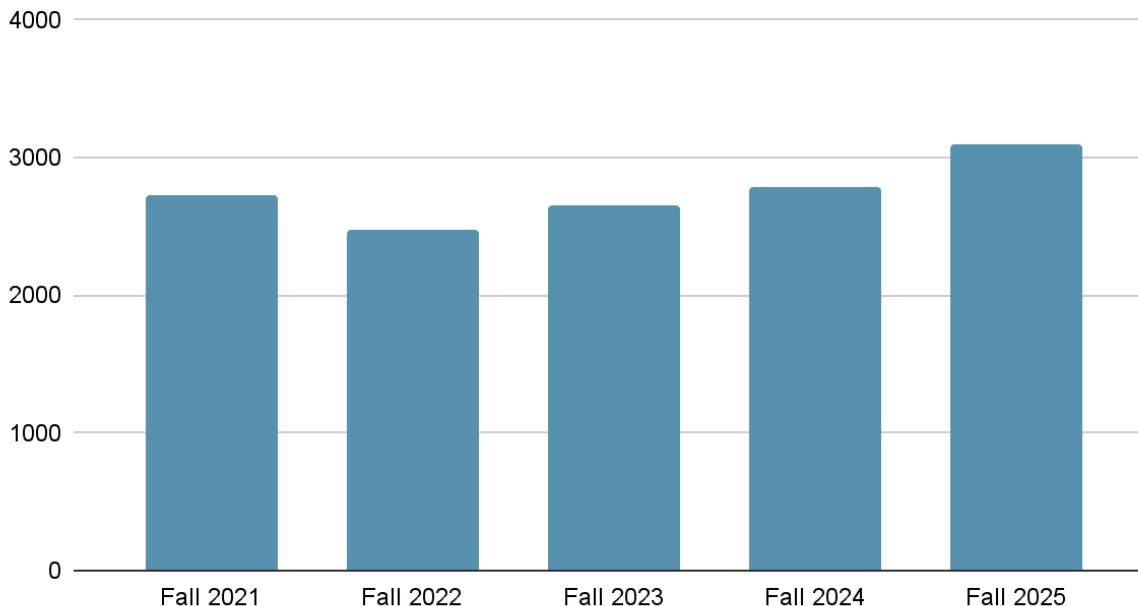


# Enrollment

Fall Enrollment

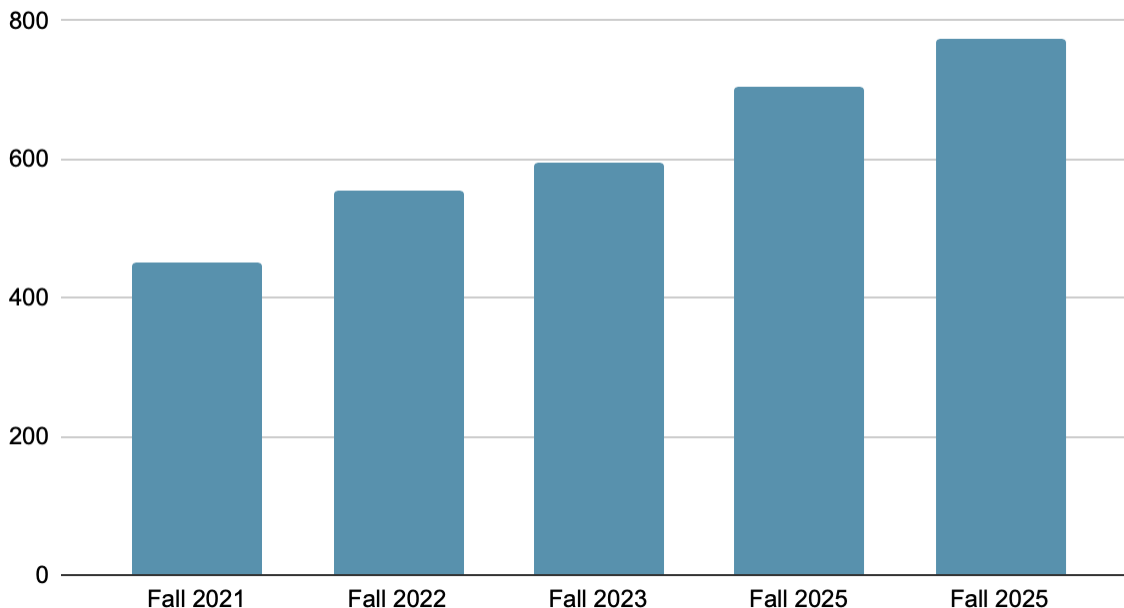

**Early College enrollment at UHMC has seen significant increases in the past 5 years.**

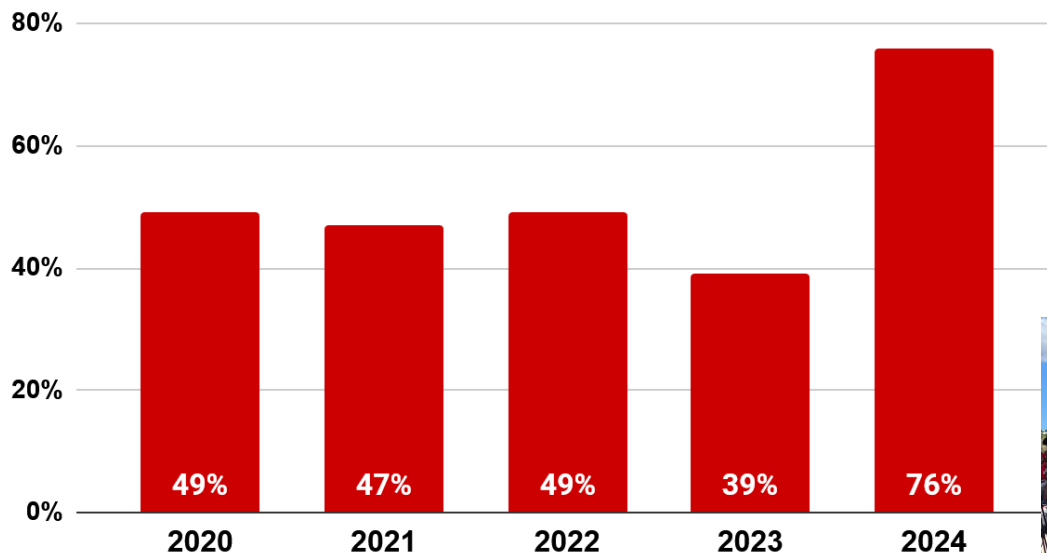
Early College Enrollment

Lahainaluna Graduating Class

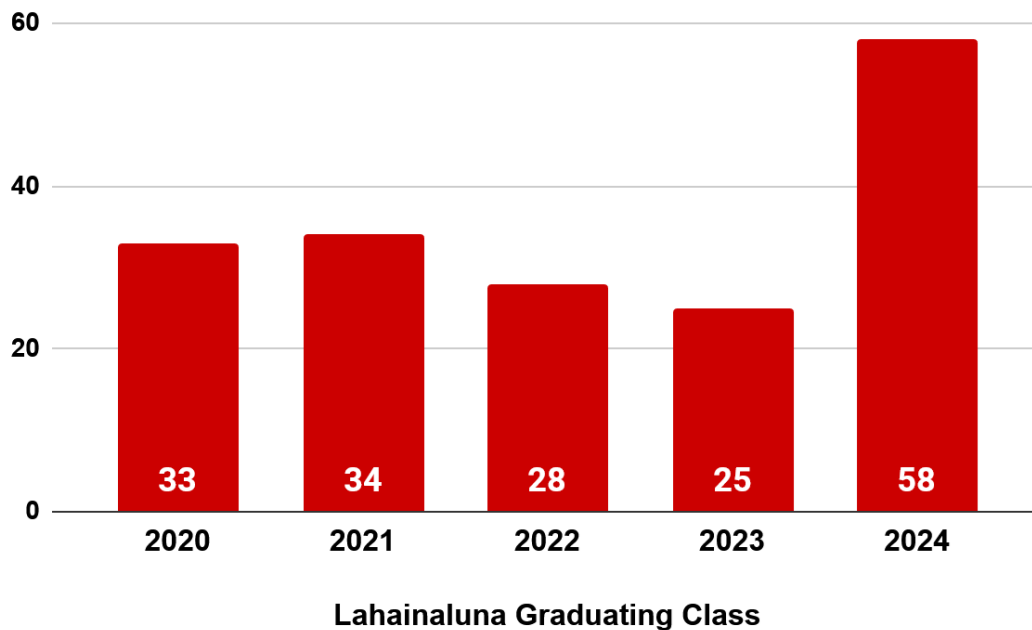
Class of 2024 experienced a large increase in college going rates due to financial support to attend UH colleges.

Both Mānoa and Maui College will continue the promise for the Class of 2025.

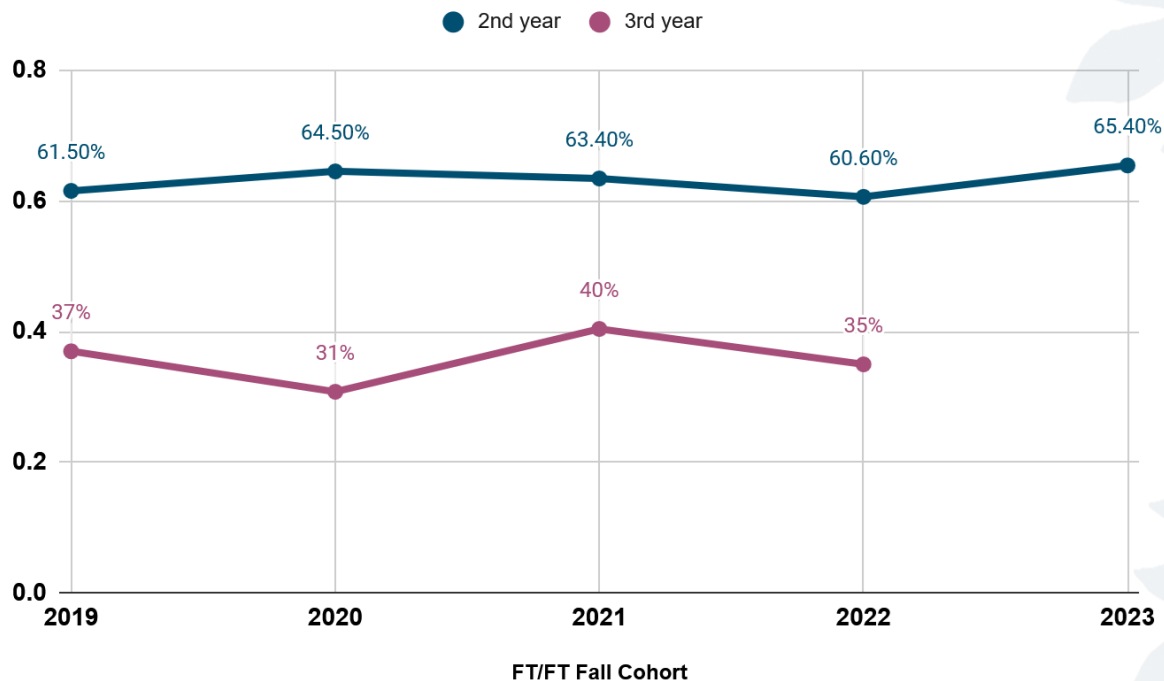

## First Time, Full Time 3yr Retention



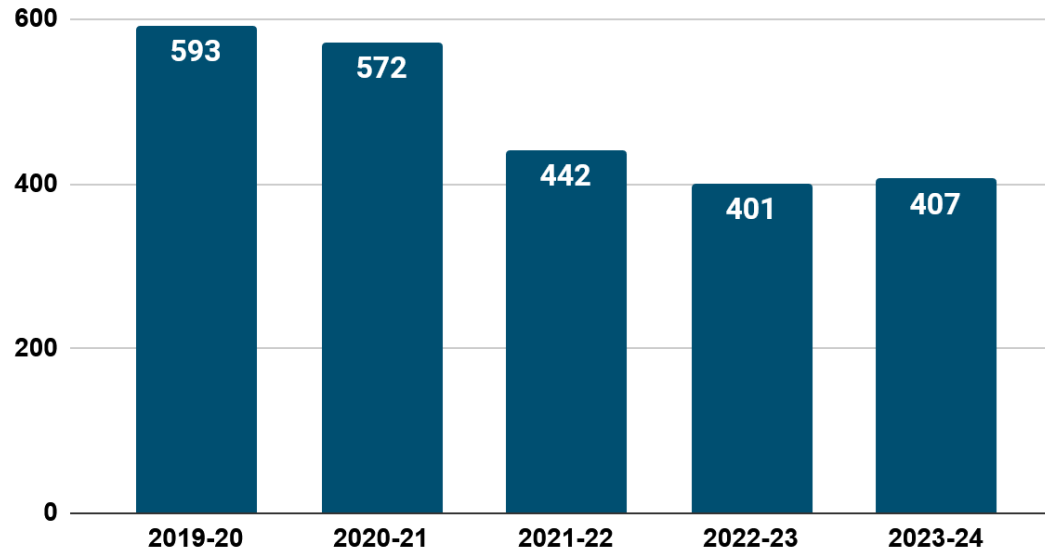

# UHMC Construction Programs: Comprehensive Impact & Results

## WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT SUCCESS

- Merging Training Programs
- 752+ total noncredit construction enrollments  
(Jan 2024 May 2025)
- 100 unduplicated students supported with \$136,175 in tuition assistance
- 250+ students trained in Free Basic Carpentry
- 105+ apprenticeship pathway training participants across electrical, maintenance, and carpentry





## Employer Partnerships

- Developed a Pre-Apprenticeship program for Maui Electric Plant Technicians
- CNA to LPN Program on 4 Islands
- Expanding Dental Hygiene to Kona
- Habitat for Humanity Construction Coordinators

## Community Impact

- **HALE PĀPĀ PROJECT RESULTS:** 31 sheds delivered to fire survivors since August 2024
- Direct employment outcomes: Students securing jobs with Lāhainā reconstruction contractors
- Community organizations served: Waiola Church, Lāhainā Jodo Mission bringing back Bon Dance
