1. **Call to Order** - Tom Thompson called the meeting to order. Each delegate was provided a conference evaluation form, a copy of Our Alliance, and a PIN survey. The conference evaluation form and PIN survey should be completed by the end of the business meeting.
2. **Review of Agenda** - Tom Thompson - A discussion of Our Alliance document was added to the agenda. **Joe Sertich moved approval, second by John Scott. Agenda, as modified, approved unanimously.**
3. **Approval of Minutes:** April 16, 2010, Maui, Hawaii - **Greg Smith moved approval of the minutes of the last meeting, second by Irene Lewis. Minutes approved unanimously.**
4. **Treasurer's Report** - Bill Warner presented the December 31, 2010 financial statement. The checking account has a balance of \$14,751.73 and \$22,757.31 in the investment account for a total balance of \$37,509.04. Dues collections for 2010 were \$13,000.00 and \$6,675 for 2011 dues. Dues for 2011 were increase to \$750 (US) at the last meeting. The financial statement is attached. **Larry Litecky moved approval of the financial statement, second by Tony Hanlon. The December 31, 2010 financial statement was approved unanimously.**

5. **A Brief History of PIN** - Bill Warner provided a brief history of PIN. PIN was founded on April 29, 1979 and is celebrating its 32<sup>nd</sup> anniversary. The initial network was between Canadian and United States two-year colleges. PIN's primary founders were Abe Konrad, University of Alberta and Don Morgan, University of Minnesota. Abe and Don served as Executive Secretaries who provided network communication, conference planning, and other administrative functions. Geoffrey Melling became the United Kingdom Executive Secretary in 1988. The administrative structure was restructured in 1993 and Bill Warner became the Executive Director. The founding PIN president was Stan Sahlstrom, University of Minnesota Technical College at Crookston.

Other countries were added to form a more international network:

1988 - United Kingdom	2007 - Fiji

1998 - Netherlands	

The first PIN conference was hosted by Red River Community College (Winnipeg, Canada) and the University of Minnesota Technical College (Crookston, Minnesota - USA) in September of 1979.

6. **Presidents Report** - State of PIN, Plan of Work, Actions of Executive Committee  
Tom Thompson reported the PIN Executive Committee has met three times by teleconference since the last annual meeting and once during the 2011 conference. Tom is planning to use video conferencing for some meetings this next year. Tom reviewed the current strategic initiatives:

**Confirming our core purpose** - PIN is a network designed to bring Senior Executives together in a safe space to share information and to discuss challenges, triumphs and disappointments. Greg Smith, with input from John Scott and Bill Warner developed the paper "PIN Vibrancy - The Way Forward." The paper will assist in defining the core purpose. In addition, the survey of PIN members would provide valuable information for confirming the core purpose.

**Extending our geographic footprint** - Phil Ker felt progress was being made to extend PIN membership. The committee saw progress in expanding the geographic footprint with the addition of Hyecheon University in South Korea.

**Extending our institutional footprint** - The Executive Committee had previously indicated that university colleges would be welcome as members.

**PIN - a 21<sup>st</sup> Century Network - Irene Lewis & Clyde Sakamoto** - Irene Lewis and Clyde Sakamoto are making progress for implementing common standards for video conferencing. The plan is to survey PIN institutions regarding video capabilities.

**Parallel activity** - Our Alliance - Joe Sertich, Phil Ker and John Scott developed Our Alliance for discussion. The intent of the document is to develop a common understanding and expectations of PIN members. The Our Alliance document identifies (1) How we will approach our work, (2) Relationships and (3) Decision-making. The following discussion points were shared:

Our Alliance discussion included the following comments:

**Larry Litecky** comes to hear about similar issues in other, diverse settings and gain inspiration from what others do. There is a diversity of instructional context, with applications in many settings.

**Paul Binney** stated that members can structure their own involvements in PIN.

**John Maddock** felt the primary obligation of a member is to share with other members.

**Greg Smith** indicated that you do not get full benefit of PIN unless you attend the conference.

**Clyde Sakamoto** encouraged delegates to share materials from this conference to those who did not attend.

**Jeanne Goshgarian** felt it would be helpful to share the evaluation comments on the website.

**John Maddock** asked to have materials from conference on the website.

**John McKee** appreciated the sharing of experiences.

**Joe Sertich moved acceptance of Our Alliance, second by Clyde Sakamoto. Motion approved unanimously.** A copy of Our Alliance is attached.

7. **PIN Leadership Institute** - Phil Ker - A professional development institute for senior managers. The proposed program would include: 1. Role of President/CEO - reality of the role, and how it differs from other senior management roles, skills and knowledge essential to the role, and how to ensure these are developed, personal and professional development 2. Finding and applying for your president/CEO role 3. Political dimension, politicians 4. Leading an effective senior team

Practicalities: Two days program prior to the conference

PIN leadership institute discussion included the following comments:

**Larry Litecky**- Person attending do a self assessment, with next steps after the conference - home CEO provides additional experiences.

**Jerry Webber**- Who would be eligible? Emphasis on international possibilities.

**John Scott** - People who can expand their own experiences.

**Fraser Durie**- The experience would include the institute and the PIN conference = international peer support

**Jerry Webber** - sessions prior to conference, during conference, and after conference.

**Larry Litecky** - President and institute person do the institute together

**Judy Morris**- Attend conference with president - have after conference session

**John Maddock** - Selection by president may cause problem - not succession planning.

There may be a connection with the Leadership Benchmarking survey. The survey could be administered prior to attending the institute.

**Deb Brennan**- International should be primary emphasis Institute reinforce the international emphasis

**Phil Ker** will do a second draft of the Leadership Institute and email it for additional feedback.

8. **Leadership Benchmarking Project** - John Maddock  
Several PIN members have expressed interest in the survey. The survey is now being modified after the pilot project. The weighting scales are being revised. Local governments will be using the survey. Feedback will be available by the next conference.

9. **PIN Conference 2012 and Beyond** - Tom Thompson  
**2012 Bahrain** - Hasan Almulla made a presentation during the conference. The conference theme is: Connecting Generations, Inspiring Innovations. The plan is to offer the conference in conjunction with the education conference sponsored by the Crown Prince. Dates will not be finalized until the education conference is identified. It appears the education conference may be October 12-14, 2012. The PIN conference would then be October 15-18, 2012, with social activities on October 19-20, 2012.  
  
**2013 Australia** - Australian PIN members have had discussions regarding a possible host for 2013. Since the Melbourne area has hosted several conferences the possibility of the conference being held in Queensland is being explored. The dates have not been determined.
10. **Membership Update** - Bill Warner presented the membership update information for 2011. There are currently 36 members, compared to 37 members in 2010. Members that did not renew include: Durham College, Sheridan College, Northwest Community College, Stevenson College, and Alexandria Community and Technical College. New members were Red River College, The Open Polytechnic, Community Colleges of Spokane, and Kingsborough Community College. Two name changes were noted: University of Hawaii Maui College and SAIT Polytechnic.
11. **Visits and Exchanges** - Bill Warner described the PIN Visit and Exchange program available to all PIN members. The exchange and visit program is designed to facilitate faculty/staff exchanges and visits among PIN member colleges. The exchanges and visits are designed to enhance the professional development of faculty/staff and to further international understanding of two-year colleges. The colleges are expected to support and facilitate the exchange/visit process. The college and the faculty/staff members develop the exchange or visit to meet their institutional and individual objectives.  
  
PIN will award up to two \$1,000 (USD) stipends to facilitate faculty/staff exchanges and visits to each country for the academic year. It is expected that the college will match the dollar amount of the stipend. The match will be cash or an in-kind contribution.

- Increased scrutiny of higher education
