As 2021 nears its half way point, many of us are starting to see that proverbial "light at the end of the tunnel". The COVID Pandemic is slowly losing its grip and as vaccination rates continue to rise, we can start to see life returning back to a more "normal" state. This webinar series has been a great initiative and is building up to our PIN Leadership Summit - October 17 – 22, hosted in Maui by Maui College. The theme of this year's summit is Leadership for Sustainability in a Post-COVID World. The agenda will feature keynotes, leadership round tables, educational field trips and opportunities for post-secondary leaders from around the world to share their priorities and initiatives. We will also review the collaborative Cyber Security Training Program (led by Lambton College) that emerged from our Seattle Leadership Summit in 2019 and consider the next collaborative initiative for PIN members to work on in the months ahead.

The learning opportunity at this year's Summit is going to be tremendous and I would encourage you to attend.

Theme: Leadership for Sustainability in a Post-COVID World

October 17 - October 22, 2021

The theme of this year's Summit is "Post-secondary Leadership in a Post-COVID World". It will focus on sustainability leadership — tying together environmental, economic and social aspects and the role of post-secondary institutions in supporting our communities and local economies, including in their post-covid recovery efforts.

Four leadership lenses will be applied: personal leadership; institutional leadership; community and/or local economy leadership; and global leadership.

The Leadership Summit will include case studies of practice and innovation and will provide insight and examples that can be adopted, adapted and applied to make a difference at home.

Topic:

What can Post-Secondary Leadership Learn About Sustainability From Farmers?

Description:

A global entrepreneur and thought leader, Robert's latest work, AGvisorPRO, has been focused on leveraging technology to shrink time and space addressing the "pinch point" to more sustainable farming systems, that is, the right advice from the right trusted advisor at the right time.

On October 15th, 2020 Robert had the opportunity to address the UN_FAO Committee on Global Sustainability where his message was "focus on the outcomes not the ideology". In his 2nd book, FOOD 5.0 How We Feed The Future, Robert looks at how we can ensure agriculture is "infinitely sustainable" by focusing science integration and technology convergence.

As one of Canada's 50 Most Influential Agriculture leaders, Robert is playing a key role in supporting the re-shaping of post-secondary institution connection to the business community to better serve Environmental-Societal-Governance (ESG) issues. As a member of The 2019 Alberta Talent Advisory Council on Technology, he was involved in the formulation of strategies for post-secondary institutions in the province which laid out 11 key recommendations for institutional leaders as they formulate how to increase the effectiveness of meeting social and business needs.

While having a background in agriculture, Robert's business experience combined with his involvement in Strategic Coach (28 yrs) and Abundance 360 (9 yrs) has resulted in him being engaged in enterprises from farming in Uganda, to serving on the boards of tech and blue hydrogen co's.

Rob's message to PIN will be inspirational and pragmatic. It will be fun and we will all learn a ton!

THE AUWAHI FOREST RESTORATION PROJECT

THE AUWAHI FOREST RESTORATION PROJECT... (Auwahi project for short) originated in 1997 as a grass roots, community-based effort in working in collaboration with `Ulupalakua Ranch to save tracts of highly endangered dry forest at Auwahi as biological and cultural sanctuaries. Based on ecological success and community support, the Ranch committed progressively larger tracts towards forest restoration and preservation. Since inception, the Auwahi project has restored forest primarily with the efforts of supervised volunteers from the community. As time proceeded, we have developed a large group of volunteers that are passionate, informed, and with strong sense of 'aloha 'aina (love of land) for Hawaiian places, forests and culture. The Auwahi project has been in operation for 19 years and is now widely regarded as one of the most successful examples of community-based native forest restoration in the islands. Volunteers, and most who visit the forest, are left moved by the experience of being in a native forest, participating in its protection, and planting seedlings of native Hawaiian trees that will likely live for hundreds of years, perpetuating this forest sanctuary for decades to come.

Hāna Ranch is a working cattle ranch on 3,600 acres in Hāna, Hawai'i that has a diverse business model. We want to be more than a sustainable business, we want to be a regenerative one, actively working to make the land and our community better each day.

The Daniel K. Inouye Solar Telescope

The Daniel K. Inouye Solar Telescope was built by a broad segment of the solar physics community. The construction phase of the project, to build the next generation ground-based solar telescope, is almost complete and it is already taking amazing photos of the sun. DKIST is the largest solar telescope in the world and it is constructed on Haleakala (hours of the sun), proclaimed by scientist the best place in the world to see and study the sun, because of the height of the mountain and the low levels of dust particles found at Haleakala during the day.



Lambton College-PIN Cyber Security Training Program

A Successful PIN initiative in Cyber Security

At the PIN conference in Bellevue in 2019, a discussion regarding collaborative projects resulted in the identification of a need for Cyber Security training that was short, interactive and engaging for students and employees.

After a number of attempts at finding a developer, we landed on Lambton College as the lead, in association with three other PIN college members: Olds College, Saskatchewan Polytechnic and Central Community College. The goal was to develop an innovative Cyber Security curriculum using interactive design and gamification.

The new Cyber Security Training program is being developed as an online game that allows users to defend Earth's digital information against an interstellar virus. Users will learn about cybersecurity fundamentals and solve interactive puzzles and assessments to protect the planet.

The training will consist of 3 key learning modules with up to 12 Cyber Security Specific learning outcomes. The subjects included in the course include Password Management,

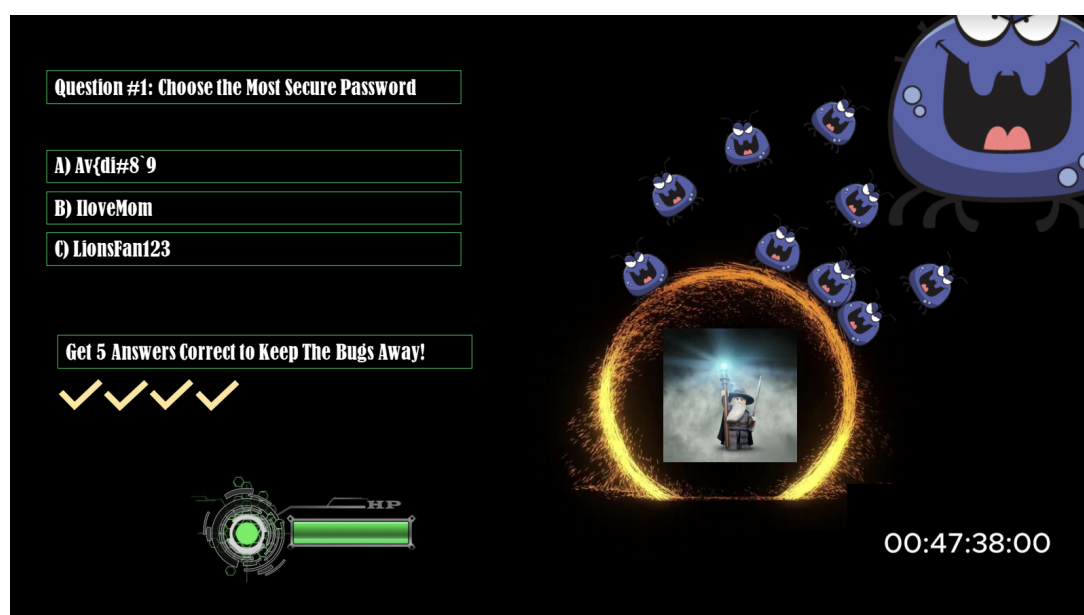
The Human Firewall, Physical Security Protocols, Phishing Smishing and Malware, Social Engineering & Working Remotely, and more. Students will begin navigating the curriculum in easy to access learning modules that include a gamified assessment. The initial stages will introduce the content with ease; however, the students will need to pay attention, as the difficulty of each level will increase incrementally throughout the game. This has been designed to keep the learner engaged in the content to ensure maximum retention of knowledge.

The Cyber Security Training program will launch in September of 2021.

The development team has already targeted future development for this course, that could include a competitive leaderboard that would allow different departments or colleges to challenge each other through various mini games that will test their knowledge of Cyber Security in an interactive and engaging manner.

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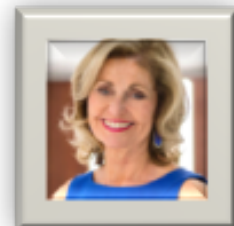


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
